Newlands has hosted international matches in the three decades since it opened, hosting three consecutive World Cups. In terms of the five largest grounds, Newlands was the largest until the construction of Newlands in 2010, with a capacity of 41,000. Newlands' other major rival was Cape Town's Bidvest Wanderers Stadium, built in 2012, which has a capacity of 47,000. Three further grounds in Cape Town and its suburbs have hosted international matches. The Newlands-Keizerdolen Cricket Stadium is used for football, and the Wanderers

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
